Roger Williams University is pleased to announce 2 new, exciting programs within the School of Justice Studies for the fall 2009 semester:

First, our Master's of Science in Criminal Justice is now available completely on-line. The master's program permits students to explore Justice System Management, which focuses on modern administrative theory, legal issues in personnel administration and the management of criminal justice agencies as well as the field of Criminology, examining the nature and causes of crime. We also offer elective offerings in homeland security, legal issues, organized crime, victimology, and legal psychology.

Second, we have a 5 course graduate certificate in Digital Forensics. This program is offered entirely online and prepares students who are in professions which involve the collection, examination, presentation, or evaluation of digital materials. The primary focus of the program is on the development of skills related to evidence recovery from digital media, hidden and deleted files, problem solving with digital evidence, legal issues, and examination of mobile devices. These courses may also be applied towards the elective requirements within the Master's of Science in Criminal Justice program.
