Directed by student, play depicts the ugly aftermath of infidelity

BRISTOL, R.I., March 14, 2007 – Every action has a reaction, whether intentional or not—the lesson of unintended consequences of infidelity is depicted in the Craig Wright play “Orange Flower Water.” The play will be performed at Roger Williams University on Friday, March 23, and Saturday, March 24.

The two performances begin at 8 p.m. in the Performing Arts Center on the University’s Bristol campus at One Old Ferry Road. The final directing project for senior Theatre major Ariana Goterch of Lawrence, Mass., “Orange Flower Water” follows two families torn apart by the aftermath of an extramarital affair. Two couples and longtime friends watch as their marriages unravel before their eyes and then try to pick up the pieces.
