Applicants who have not completed those courses satisfactorily may be required to take either the GMAT or general GRE. **Criminal Justice:** general GRE or MAT exam may be required if cumulative undergraduate GPA is less than 3.00. **Joint Criminal Justice/Law (M.S./J.D.):** LSAT required. **Literacy Education, Public Administration and Leadership:** No entrance exam required. All international students must demonstrate English proficiency through satisfactory TOEFL or IELTS results. Official scores must be reported directly to the Office of Continuing Studies and Graduate Admissions by the testing agency; the ETS code for Roger Williams University is 3729. **Forensic Psychology:** general GRE required. **Teaching:** Official Praxis I PPST or C-PPST scores with the following minimum scores: Praxis I PPST: Math 175, Reading 175, Writing 173 Praxis I C-PPST: Composite score of 523 with no individual test score more than 3 points below the minimum.

- an ability to organize programmatic content
- a commitment to professionalism in the studio.

In addition, you may include up to three other examples of your work in related fields, such as work done in construction materials and assemblies, computer graphics, art drawing and the like.
