Undergraduate International Student Scholarships

Presidential Excellence Scholarship USD \$16,000 per year

- Minimum Grade Point Average (GPA) required for consideration: 3.5 on a 4.0 scale
- Offered to select incoming freshmen (First-year students only)

Achievement Scholarship USD \$10,000 - USD \$13,000 per year

- Minimum Grade Point Average (GPA) required for consideration: 3.0 on a 4.0 scale
- Offered to select incoming freshmen and transfer students

Note: The number of scholarships awarded is limited and dependent upon the applicant pool for the year. Scholarships are awarded for the duration of the student's undergraduate study, not to exceed four years. Scholarships are automatically renewed each year, as long as the student maintains the set criteria.

Undergraduate English Language Proficiency Requirements RWU Direct Admission

Students that meet either one of the requirements below will be considered for direct admission to their program of study or major.

Minimum Score Requirements:

- TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language): Greater than 550 PBT / 213 CBT / 79 IBT
- IELTS (International English Language Testing System): Greater than 6.0 bandwidth
- ELS: Successful completion of Level 112 Intensive Program at the ELS Language Center

RWU Bridge Program

The RWU Bridge Program is approximately one semester in duration and offers advanced-level ESL courses. Students are concurrently enrolled in two ESL (English as a Second Language) classes and approximately two university courses.

Minimum Score Requirements:

- TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language): Between 500 PBT / 173 CBT / 61 IBT and 550 PBT / 213 CBT / 79 IBT
- IELTS (International English Language Testing System): Between 5.0 and 6.0 bandwidth
- ELS: Successful completion of Level 109 Intensive Program at the ELS Language Center

ELS Language Center (Conditional Admission)

The ELS Center provides English language support to all ESL (English as a Second Language) speakers. The entire program consists of 12 levels, from the basic to advanced levels; each session is one month in duration. Students are able to enroll at the start of any session during the year.

Eligibility Requirements:

- TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language): Less than 500 PBT / 173 CBT / 61 IBT
- IELTS (International English Language Testing System): Less than 5.0 bandwidth

Note: Submitting proof of English proficiency is optional at the time of admission for international students (non-U.S. citizens). Students who do not submit proof of English proficiency will be considered for conditional admission to RWU and will be recommended to enroll at the ELS Language Center.
