- Provide students with internship/practicum experiences that will promote and develop professional skills in clinical forensic psychology

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Applications to the program are due by February 15 for fall admission. Students should have an undergraduate degree in psychology, criminal justice, or a related field and have satisfactorily completed coursework in research methods and statistics to be considered.

To apply, applicants must submit the following items to the Office of Graduate Admission:

- 1. Completed application form accompanied by the \$50 application fee
- Official transcripts of all undergraduate and graduate coursework
- Letter of Intent (two double-spaced pages maximum)
 describing your interest in the program, your career goals,
 and how you can positively contribute to the graduate
 program at Roger Williams University
- 4. Official report of Graduate Record Examination (GRE) scores sent directly by the Educational Testing Service (ETS). The ETS School Code for Roger Williams University is 3729.
- 5. Three (3) letters of recommendation attesting to your potential to succeed in graduate school
- If your first language is not English, an official report of TOEFL or IELTS results
