The Graduate Certificate in Urban and Regional Planning provides students and professionals with the option of deepening knowledge of urban, regional, and community planning practices. Certificate courses are based on core concepts of sustainability and smart growth to provide a strong foundation for planning in a world of diminishing resources, environmental degradation, and climate change.

Students who complete the certificate will understand the theory of planning, stakeholder engagement, land use and physical planning and its relationship to urban design, environmental/heritage conservation, transportation planning, sustainable development, planning law, and principles of equity and social justice. Potential areas of employment include architecture, landscape architecture and planning practices, governmental affairs, non-profit advocacy, private consulting, and public policy.

Students can earn the certificate independently or with no additional credits as part of the Master of Architecture or M.S. Preservation Practices programs in the Cummings School of Architecture.
