FUNDING FACTORS TO CONSIDER: CALCULATING COST OF ATTENDANCE The budgeted Cost of

Attendance is a calculation of total cost by Roger Williams University that is used to determine a student's level of financial need. It is a total of tuition, mandatory fees, room, board (where applicable), and estimated cost of books and other living expenses for students at Roger Williams University.

INSTITUTIONAL AID:

Merit-based Scholarships: Roger Williams University has scholarships based on academic record with additional opportunities for qualified applicants to receive aid based on talent, ability, or special skills related to your program of interest. Beginning in Fall 2022, accepted international applicants are guaranteed a scholarship of \$26,000 a year. Additional scholarships are available for qualified students in years 2-4 based on academic program and achievement.

Travel Grant: Roger Williams University provides a travel grant of \$1500 to all students who live outside of the northeast US. This grant is credited to your account at the time a student makes their tuition deposit. The Travel Grant renews annually.

PRIVATE AID:

The three primary opportunities for additional private aid comes from Grants, Scholarships, and Loans.

Grants & Scholarships: Grants and Scholarships are free for qualified students and do not require repayment. Many opportunities for undergraduate study are available only to U.S. citizens and permanent residents. However, there are free scholarship databases as well as private, corporate, nonprofit, and government scholarship funds that serve undergraduate international students.

Private Loans: The majority of private education loans require that you must be a U.S citizen or permanent resident. International students can apply with a creditworthy U.S. citizen or permanent resident cosigner. Here are some common options:
