Facilities

Theatre classes and productions take place in The Performing Arts Center, affectionately known to students as “The Barn.” This flexible black box space becomes a second home to students in the performing arts department, allowing you to form a close-knit community.

Extracurricular Activities

- Theatre majors and non-Theatre majors alike can join Stage Company, a club run out of “The Barn” that produces several full-length and one-act plays, along with other performance types.
- Each academic year, the program sponsors trips to see three or four professional productions by companies like Trinity Repertory, The Gamm Theatre, Wilbury Theatre Group, and American Repertory Theatre.

Faculty

Your professors are experienced artists and performers from across the country and around the world. They develop personal, meaningful relationships with students, helping them find their individual style, develop their craft, and design a career path. Visiting guest artists offer additional styles, forms, and viewpoints through residencies and repertory work.

CURRICULUM

Structure

As a Theatre major at RWU, the stage is your laboratory, allowing you to demonstrate, reinforce, and master the skills you learn in the classroom. All Theatre students take courses in Acting, Stagecraft, Design, Musical Theatre, Theatre History, Stage Management, and Directing. You will also choose three courses in Dramatic Literature, History, and Theory, such as British Theatre and Performing Arts or Asian Drama and Dance. You may use your remaining electives to concentrate on the Acting or Design track and/or a second major or minor.

Final Projects

- Senior Theatre majors have the option to complete senior acting, design, or directing projects. These are full productions that take place in the spring semester and give them extensive experience, setting them apart from the competition for jobs upon graduation.
- In preparation to enter the acting or directing world, you will complete a professional interview before graduating. Actors present a professional audition, while directors and designers offer conceptual plans for a hypothetical production, both receiving constructive criticism from the Theatre faculty.
