Structure

Creative Writing majors can design their own curriculum according to their specific interests. You will take at least one studio course in each of the following: fiction, nonfiction, screenwriting, and poetry. You can repeat any studio up to three times. The studios change each year, so students are always learning new skills, even within a particular genre. In your screenwriting course, you may focus on television writing one year and feature film writing the next.
