With a focus on experiential learning at RWU, Visual Arts maiors can:

- Take advantage of one-on-one portfolio reviews. All Visual Arts students have individualized meetings with their professors, giving them practice presenting their work to a professional audience, as well as personalized feedback.
- Intern in a creative setting. 80% of Visual Arts majors complete internships in placements such as photography studios, galleries, art magazines, museums, theaters, educational centers, and design firms.
- Attend exciting field trips. Many courses involve travel to museums, studios, and galleries in Rhode Island, Massachusetts, and New York, to see art in vibrant, contemporary spaces.
- Study abroad in global venues such as Florence, Italy.
- Work with and learn from professional visiting artists every semester.
- Show your art in a real museum. All seniors have the opportunity to curate and exhibit their work in an end-of-semester show at the Bristol Art Museum.

Facilities

You will have access to studios dedicated to the various media areas: a ceramics studio, digital media facilities, printmaking studios, a fabrication lab that includes a woodworking shop, and our painting and drawing studios.

CURRICULUM

The RWU Visual Arts department offers both a Bachelor of Arts and a Bachelor of Fine Arts. While the curriculum, faculty, and opportunity to show your work overlap, the structure and outcome of the degrees differ. The first year and a half are the same for both programs, so you have time to decide which track is right for you.

Bachelor of Arts (B.A.)

The Bachelor of Arts is an academic degree designed for students who want the arts to be a large part of their course of study, but who also may be interested in other disciplines. You may choose to pursue a B.A. if you have a broad range of interests and want to be a well-rounded candidate for a wide variety of careers after graduation.

Bachelor of Arts candidates complete the 42 credits in Visual Arts and additional credits can be used towards a second major or minor(s).

Bachelor of Fine Arts (B.F.A.)

The Bachelor of Fine Arts is a pre-professional degree, specifically designed for students who want a strong focus in the Visual Arts, are looking to develop stellar portfolios, and are thinking about graduate school in the future. Two thirds (72) of your course credits are devoted to the Visual Arts. The B.F.A. track requires more studio courses, more history and theory courses, and a written thesis.

All B.F.A. students must complete an internship-for-credit in the field.

Faculty

Your professors are working artists who understand your interests and enthusiastically share their expertise. They will become mentors to you during your undergraduate studies and beyond, helping you forge your path in the art world. They will support you, not only in the art itself, but in gaining professional skills such as networking, resume writing, and obtaining grants and residencies.
