Learn and Do More at RWU

With a focus on experiential learning at RWU, philosophy majors can:

- Partner with local Archives and Preservation Centers for research on topics like Feminist Theory and the History of Slave Trading in Rhode Island.

- Discuss philosophical questions each month in the on-campus Socrates Café.

Structure

The philosophy major develops skills in careful reading, critical thinking, and clear, effective writing. This program introduces you to the discipline, acquaints you with the world's major philosophic figures and encourages you to explore your own philosophical questions. Your program culminates with a senior thesis in which you analyze and critically evaluate an important philosophical issue of your choice.
