The secondary education program prepares students to become exemplary high school teachers who excel in helping students learn and grow in our increasingly global world. Combining field experience and student teaching, the program offers deep subject matter knowledge and real-world teaching experience needed to succeed in today's schools. A degree in secondary education gives you the foundation to become a secondary school teacher in mathematics, biology, chemistry, general science, English, history/social studies, or world languages, including French, German, Spanish, Italian, and Latin.

### **Complete a Teaching Placement**

The best place to learn how to teach is right inside a high school classroom. At RWU, you will graduate with much more than the required number of practicum hours for the state of Rhode Island, as well as many other state credential programs.

The program hosts guest speakers each semester to discuss global issues directly affecting today's youth. Lectures on immigration, global warming, and race help prepare education majors to teach in the current climate.

# **Fellowships**

Secondary education majors can take advantage of the Hassenfeld Student Leadership Fellowship Program, which funds opportunities for community projects and research, both locally and globally.

# **Faculty**

As an secondary education major, your professors become lifelong mentors.

Small class size allows faculty to get to know students' interests, skills and goals. RWU faculty have many years of teaching experience and are available for guidance both in and outside the classroom. During your senior year, education faculty will mentor you throughout the job-seeking process or as you apply to graduate school.

#### **Resources**

You will graduate ahead of the game by taking advantage of unique career development resources. The program is constantly adjusting to the changing teaching requirements for licensure.

- Secondary education majors can also become certified to teach middle school if they have taken 21 credits in math, history, English, or science and an additional three courses in middle school teaching. The courses are offered at RWU as an add-on certificate program.
- Juniors and seniors can take the Sheltered English Immersion (SEI) course to meet the Massachusetts requirement.
- All students will graduate having met the 24-week teaching practicum requirement in Rhode Island.
- The program provides professional preparation such as mock interviews and resume-writing workshops, so students graduate confident in their abilities to apply for jobs or graduate school.

#### CURRICULUM

All secondary education majors take two courses in Level 1: Exploring the Profession, and five courses in Level II: Preparing to Teach. Majors also take three content knowledge courses in their area of certification: mathematics, science, English, social studies, foreign language, or dance. In Level III, you complete your teaching practicum and Performing in the Classroom coursework.

#### Licensure

All teacher education programs at RWU are approved by the Rhode Island Department of Education. Under the National Association of State Directors of Teacher Education and Certification (NASDTEC) agreement, our graduates are eligible for certification in 47 states. Testing requirements vary for each state.

# **Special Education 4 + 1 Program**

As an undergraduate elementary education or secondary education major, you may apply to take two additional courses and earn six graduate credits during your senior year. If in good standing, you may continue on in one additional year of full-time study in the Master of Arts in Special Education Program. You will complete the remaining eight (for elementary special education candidates) or nine (for secondary special education candidates) as a matriculated graduate student. Candidates interested in this program must apply during their undergraduate junior year for conditional acceptance.
